

- Physical assessment

- Cognition
- Compliance
- Consider the Environment

- What are the seating goals?
- improve posture
- improve function
- improve independence
- facilitate pressure care management-aid repositioning
- facilitate transfers
- reduce manual handling
- reduce carer intervention
- prevent deterioration

Step 2 - selecting a chair category

How does the service user transfer?


- independent




Seat depth
